

## Supplication Prayer

### The Necessity of Supplication

*deesis*

N.T. *deesis*      *deo/deomai*    &    *proseuche*  
O.T. *hanan*      *palal*

Luke 1:13 But the angel said unto him, Fear not, Zacharias: for thy prayer *deesis* is heard; and thy wife Elisabeth shall bear thee a son, and thou shalt call his name John.

Luke 2:37 And she was a widow of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers *deesis* night and day.

Acts 1:14 These all continued with one accord in prayer (*proseuche*) and supplication *deesis*, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.

Ephesians 6:18 Praying (*proseuchomai*) always with all prayer (*proseuche*) and supplication *deesis* in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication *deesis* for all saints;

Philippians 4:6-7 6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer (*proseuche*) and supplication *deesis* with thanksgiving let your requests (*aitema*) be made known unto God. 7 And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

1 Timothy 2:1-3 1 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications *deesis*, prayers, intercessions *enteuxis*, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; 2 For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. 3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour;

1 Peter 3:12 For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers *deesis*: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil.

James 5:16-18 16 Confess your faults one to another, and pray *euchomai* one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer *deesis* of a righteous man availeth much. 17 Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. 18 And he prayed *deesis* again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

***deo (the root of deesis) to be bound, secured to something***

Matthew 16:17-19 17 And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven. 18 And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. 19 And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind *deo* on earth shall be bound *deo* in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

Matthew 18:18-20 18 Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind *deo* on earth shall be bound *deo* in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. 19 Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask (*aiteo*), it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven. 20 For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.

*To ask direct superior in authority structure     aiteo     aitema     (sha'al)*

A Principle of Deliverance

Luke 13:16 And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound *deo*, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?

Spiritual Warfare

Mark 3:23-27 23 And he called them unto him, and said unto them in parables, How can Satan cast out Satan? 24 And if a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. 25 And if a house be divided against itself, that house cannot stand. 26 And if Satan rise up against himself, and be divided, he cannot stand, but hath an end. 27 No man can enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he will first bind *deo* the strong man; and then he will spoil his house.

Revelation 9:14 Saying to the sixth angel which had the trumpet, Loose the four angels which are bound *deo* in the great river Euphrates.

***deomai* – confident assertion aimed at insisting upon what one is bound to.**

Dealing with the demonic

Luke 8:28 When he saw Jesus, he cried out, and fell down before him, and with a loud voice said, What have I to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God most high? I beseech *deomai* thee, torment me not.

Mark 5:3 Who had his dwelling among the tombs; and no man could bind **deo** him, no, not with chains:

Luke 8:38 Now the man out of whom the devils were departed besought *deomai* him that he might be with him: but Jesus sent him away, saying...

Luke 9:37-40 37 And it came to pass, that on the next day, when they were come down from the hill, much people met him. 38 And, behold, a man of the company cried out, saying, Master, I beseech *deomai* thee, look upon my son: for he is mine only child. 39 And, lo, a spirit taketh him, and he suddenly crieth out; and it teareth him that he foameth again, and bruising him hardly departeth from him. 40 And I besought *deomai* thy disciples to cast him out; and they could not.

Luke 22:31-32 31 And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: 32 But I have prayed *deomai* for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren.

Harvest Prayer

Matthew 9:38 Pray *deomai* ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest.

Request for Healing from leprosy

Luke 5:12 And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold a man full of leprosy: who seeing Jesus fell on his face, and besought *deomai* him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean.

## Dealing with End Times

Luke 21: 36 Watch ye therefore, and pray *deomai* always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man.

## Transitional Moments

Acts 4:31 And when they had prayed *deomai*, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.

## Significant Additions

Acts 10:1-2 1 -- There was a certain man in Caesarea called Cornelius, a centurion of the band called the Italian band, 2 A devout man, and one that feared God with all his house, which gave much alms to the people, and prayed *deomai* to God alway.

## Intercession for the Sons

1 Thessalonians 3:10 Night and day praying *deomai* exceedingly that we might see your face, and might perfect that which is lacking in your faith?

## ***proseuche* – proactive and forward reaching, confident response to grace-inspired insight gained through supplication**

Matthew 17:21 21 Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer *proseuche* and fasting.

Matthew 21:21-22 21 Jesus answered and said unto them, Verily I say unto you, If ye have faith, and doubt not, ye shall not only do this which is done to the fig tree, but also if ye shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; it shall be done. 22 And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask (*aito*) in prayer (*proseuche*), believing, ye shall receive.

Matthew 21:13 And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer (*proseuche*); but ye have made it a den of thieves.

Acts 1:14 These all continued with one accord in prayer (*proseuche*) and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.

James 5:17-18 Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed (*proseuche*) earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. 18 And he prayed (*proseuche*) again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

Revelation 8:4 And the smoke of the incense, which came with the prayers (*proseuche*) of the saints, ascended up before God out of the angel's hand.
